palliAGED is an online resource which provides evidence, tools, guidance and practice resources about end of life and palliative care for older Australians.

Produced by CareSearch, Flinders University it is free to use and available online at www.palliaged.com.au.

How was palliAGED developed?

palliAGED was developed by CareSearch in consultation with experts to provide the best available evidence.

The content is based on consolidation, updating and revision of the Guidelines for a Palliative Approach in Residential Aged Care (APRAC) and the Guidelines for a Palliative Approach for Aged Care in the Community Setting (COMPAC) guidance documents.

Who is palliAGED for?

Although primarily for health and aged care practitioners, resources are also available for community members seeking information about end of life issues. The community information can be useful in understanding any planning and care options for now or in the future, knowing what services are available and being more confident in asking questions or making decisions.

What it includes

palliAGED has both an Evidence Centre and a complementary Practice Centre with resources aimed at bringing evidence into everyday practice.
